Baptism: During pregnancy, approach any priest or deacon after Mass for a special blessing of the child in the womb. Soon after birth, call the secretary to arrange an interview with a staff member and details on STARTING POINT, our parent enrichment program.

Confession / Reconciliation: Confessions will be heard on Saturdays from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by appointment with one of the priests.

Marriage: Soon after engagement, approach any priest or deacon after Mass for the special blessing of an engaged couple. Call the secretary at least six months prior to the desired wedding date to begin BETTER TOGETHER, our couple's enrichment program.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the rectory to arrange for a priest to celebrate this sacrament due to serious illness, a planned medical procedure, or advanced age.

Communion of the Sick: The clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion attend to the homebound sick. Please call Jane at 718-762-2252 or the secretary to arrange temporary or long-term coverage.

From the Pastor's Desk.

Dear Parishioners,



November has begun with our celebration of All Saints and our commemoration of All Souls. On Sunday at noon, we will offer a Mass in memory of our parishioners who died this past year. The rest of the month continues to occupy a place in our minds and hearts for our beloved dead and our own mortality and hope of resurrection to eternal life. The issues of death, dying, funeral and mourning practices, and afterlife are thoughtfully presented in the series *Eternal Rest* which you can watch on Formed at your leisure. It was presented last year at this time by our Adult Faith Formation Team and very well received.

November also brings us Election Day, a very important one this year as we consider a new president as well as numerous other offices and several important proposals. The Church does not tell you who or what to vote for, but it does urge you to form your conscience and be guided by Gospel principals and values. (See last week's insert.) Many pose the question: "Are you better-off now compared to four years ago?" Personally, I would answer in the affirmative, but for me it's the wrong question. Self-interest is not my guiding star. My faith impels me to seek the common good, and in particular, the benefit of those most in need of society's care. For New Yorkers, Proposal #1 seems like a no-brainer. Who isn't for rights? That is why our NYS Bishops Conference called it a wolf in sheep's clothing and asked us to consider a deeper look at the unsaid ramifications of this proposal. (See insert of two weeks prior.) The one thing that most Americans can agree on in this divided time is that we will all be grateful for an end to this election season. But we will have to live with the consequences of our decisions for the next four years. I pray that we all vote, first of all, and secondly, that we vote wisely.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS


